

Register to vote

Londoners, first of all, make sure you register to vote. It takes a few minutes, if you head to www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

You must be aged 16 or over to register.
You can register to vote if you're:

- a British citizen or an Irish citizen
- a qualifying Commonwealth citizen
- a qualifying EU citizen: Denmark, Luxembourg, Poland, Portugal, or Spain
- an EU citizen with retained rights: Citizen of another EU country who has had permission to enter or stay in the UK since 31 December 2020, and this has continued without a break

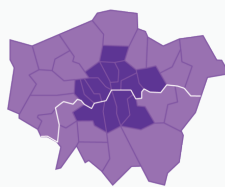
There are three types of elections in London:



Mayor of London and
London Assembly elections



General/parliamentary
elections



Local/borough
elections

British, Irish and qualifying Commonwealth citizens are eligible to vote in Mayor of London/London Assembly elections, General/parliamentary elections, and Local/borough elections.

Qualifying EU citizens or EU citizens with retained rights over the age of 18 are only eligible to vote in Mayor of London/London Assembly and Local/borough elections.

Accepted forms of photo ID

There are a number of accepted forms of photo ID that you can take to vote in person, at the polling station.
Here are a few examples:

- UK, Channel Islands or EEA driving licence
- UK, Commonwealth or EEA passport
- National identity card issued by an EEA state
- Biometric immigration document (including eVisas)
- Blue Badge scheme card
- 60+ Oyster photocard or a Freedom Pass
- Identity card bearing the Proof of Age Standards Scheme hologram (a PASS card)
- Ministry of Defence Form 90 (Defence Identity Card) and Ministry of Defence Form 100 (HM Armed Forces Veteran Card)
